



- The 1611 KJV was completed less than 100 years after Luther.
- **The translators did their best.**
- **It's likely they were highly influenced by traditional teachings during their time.**
- **Was the new moon month one of those traditional teachings?**

For precept must be upon precept, precept upon precept; line upon line, line upon line; here a little, and there a little.

There are some things that could have happened with the 1611 KJV translation to cause such a problem in only 7% of the Scriptures to establish the “**new moon**” over the “**new <chodesh> month**”!



Two possibilities must be considered.



1. The translators ignorantly made a mistake by following the Jewish traditions of their “new moon.”
2. The translators deliberately erred causing allegiance and sacred regard to be given to the moon month in place of **Yahuah's festal month start.**

Mapping the Topics for H2320 <chodesh>

1. H2320 Definition

H2320 <chodesh> must come into alignment with Moses & Torah as Yahuah's "new [chodesh] month" not Yahuah's "new moon" or man's agenda.

Only 7% of the **KEY verses** for worship statutes would be incorrectly translated as “moon(s)” when the proper translated term for H2320 <chodesh> can only be “**month(s)**”?

The prophet Isaiah in Chapter 47:13 talks about the “monthly prognosticators.”

This is a verse using “qualifiers.”
The context of the verse “qualifies”
the meaning of monthly prognosticators.

monthly [H2320] prognosticators [H3045],

Monthly here [as H2320] is translated correctly!

Isaiah 47:13 ~ Barnes' Notes

The thing referred to in the passage before us, and which **was practiced in Babylon**, was, probably, that of forecasting future events, or telling what would occur by the observation of the positions of the heavenly bodies.

[**The star-gazers**] Those who endeavor to tell what will occur by the contemplation of the relative positions of the stars.

[**The monthly prognosticators**] '**That give knowledge concerning the months.**' That is, at the commencement of the months they give knowledge of what events might be expected to occur during the month; **perhaps from the dip of the moon, or its riding high or low, etc.** ... **This whole passage would have been more literally and better translated by preserving the order of the Hebrew.**

'Let them stand up now and save thee, who are astrologers; who gaze upon the stars, **and who make known at the new moons what things will come upon thee.**'

Isaiah 47:13 ~ Jamieson, Fausset & Brown

Let ... the **monthly prognosticators** ... save thee from (these things) that shall come upon thee - those who at each new moon profess to tell thereby what is about to happen.

Maurer joins, not as the English version, 'Let them that give knowledge **concerning the months** (margin) save thee from those things that shall come upon thee; but, 'They that at new moons make known part of the things that shall come upon thee, let them (also) save thee (from them).' If they can foretell calamities, they ought also to be able to save from them; because both are the work of God.

Isaiah 47:13 ~ Keil & Delitzsch

... to look with pleasure or with interest at anything; hence Luther has rendered it correctly, die Sternkucker (Eng. ver. star-gazers).

They [Babylon's star-gazers] are described still further as those who make known with every new moon, ... things which, ... is used in a partitive sense: out of the great mass of events they select the most important, and prepare a calendar or almanac ... for the state every month.


Summary for Isa 47:13

1. There are many other Bible translations that translate Isa 47:13 according to the ways of Babylon – that of star-gazers and those that watch for every new moon – a monthly event.

3. Because the translators for the KJV used the term **“monthly prognosticators,”** rather than **“those who predict by the new moons,”** did they actually remove important context from this verse?

hey, mr. graduate, that is a good question. why didn't the translators use the word "moon" for H2320 <chodesh> this time like all the other times?



remember, the action definition for the H2320 chodesh month is still a rebuilding, renewing & repetitive occurrence. these words also describe different moon phases observed by pagan Babylon for horoscope purposes. The context was not altered.

well, around 712 BC Yahuah's festal month and the lunar month still were both 30 days in length.






**Conclusion for

Comment:

Because the exiled Jews were indoctrinated with the Babylonian calendar beginning the day with sunset and the month with the crescent moon, one can see how these two concepts go together.

1. Once the sun sets - the new day begins;
2. Once the crescent moon is sighted, the new month begins the next day!

Despite what **Yahuah's** Covenant Calendar teaches, this new pagan calendar was eventually declared as a Torah truth.

There are NO New Moons for Yahuah's Festal Months!

This error has been accepted as a "Torah truth" likely because most people examined only these 20 verses.

These things are certain:


1. The 1611 Translators absolutely mis-translated the 20 non-Torah verses using "new moons" instead of "new months."


Were these mis-translations done deliberately to remove Covenant Calendar keys in non-Torah books?
