
What does that have to do with any day-start?

However, the Premier Williness of 1 Samuel 14 claims there is only <u>ONE</u> DAY involved.

1 Sam 14:1 And it came to be ONE DAY that Yonathan son of Sha'ul said to the young man who bore his armour, "Come, and let us go over to the outpost of the Philistines which is on the other side." But he did not inform his father.

PLUS, there are 6 more confirmations that the "day" is singular, not including a new day after the sunset!
