Why another "dawn" day study?

History books speak of day commencements as being at 6 PM every day. Over recent years some claim Yahuah's day begins at sunrise or noon. In the last 10 years this truth is being restored according to creation and Torah, so you can experience the ...

At that time King Saul was

Commitment!

The 3 main characters are King Saul, his son Jonathan and one armour bearer.

Just as this honey bee is committed and “all in” what does that have to do with a study on day-start?



Jonathan's life was at stake as soon as he tasted some honey which was strictly against a **COMMAND** of King Saul that he knew nothing about!

What does that have to do with any day-start?



**Sunset
Theory
declares ...**

This COMMAND
of King Saul was given
in the Light Season.

The violation was discovered
“after the sun had set.”

**After the sun has set,
a new day begins! ??**

**If Sunset Theory is correct,
then by default, this story takes place
over the period of **two days!****

However, the
Premier Witness of
1 Samuel 14 claims
there is only ONE
DAY involved.

1 Sam 14:1 **And it came to be**
ONE DAY that Yonathan son
of Sha'ul said to the young man who bore his
armour, "Come, and let us go over to the
outpost of the Philistines which is on the
other side." But he did not inform his father.

PLUS, there are 6 more confirmations that the "day" is
singular, not including a new day after the sunset!

Dawn

Jonathan and his armour bearer exterminated 20 men on this early morning! The battle continued through the Light Season.

Samuel confirms all of these events are found in one day!

Jonathan ate honey late in the Light Season.

Saul's lot fell on **Jonathan** after the sun had set.

Sunset

Saul's command:

Do not eat food until evening!

Was this the next "day"?

How will sunset theory keep all of these events within one 24 hour cycle?
