3. Or ... Both?



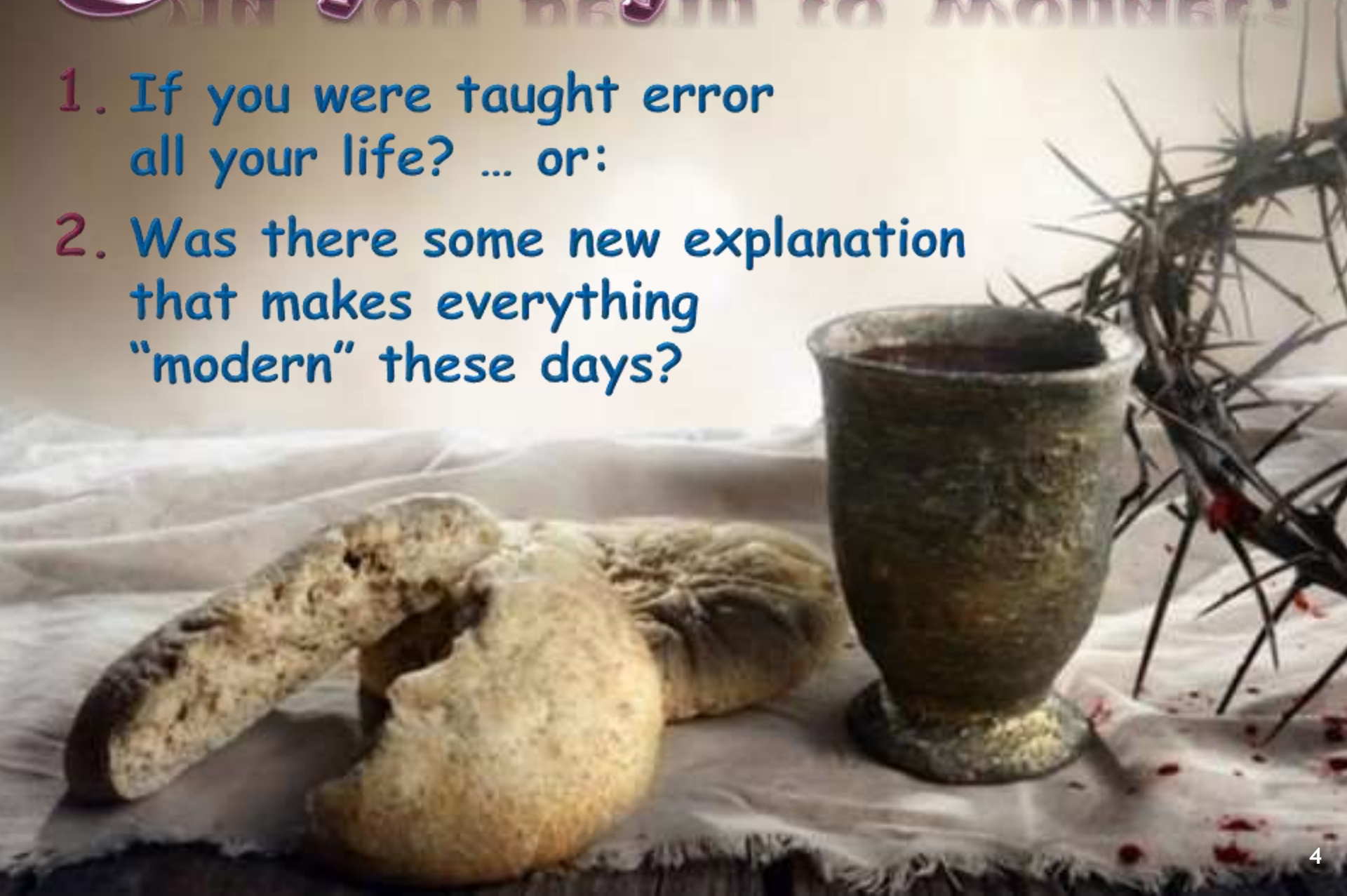
# Has this happened to you?

# The Internet had several answers:

1. You can use any bread for communion. People have totally misunderstood what communion is. It's just where you eat with brothers and sisters and remember Christ; it's that simple.





# Answer #2:

2. The Eastern Churches (except the Armenians) make use of leavened bread, while the Western Churches, **since the 11th century**, have used unleavened bread.

# Answer #3:

3. Eastern Christians associate unleavened bread **with the Old Testament** and allow only for bread with yeast, **as a symbol of the New Covenant in Christ's blood.**





# Answer #4 – Check the Scriptures for “bread”:



The Greek word for “bread” is <artos>.

- Strong's -- bread G740 artos; from G142; bread (as raised) or a loaf: KJV - (shew-) bread, loaf.

“right bread” for the Last Supper?**





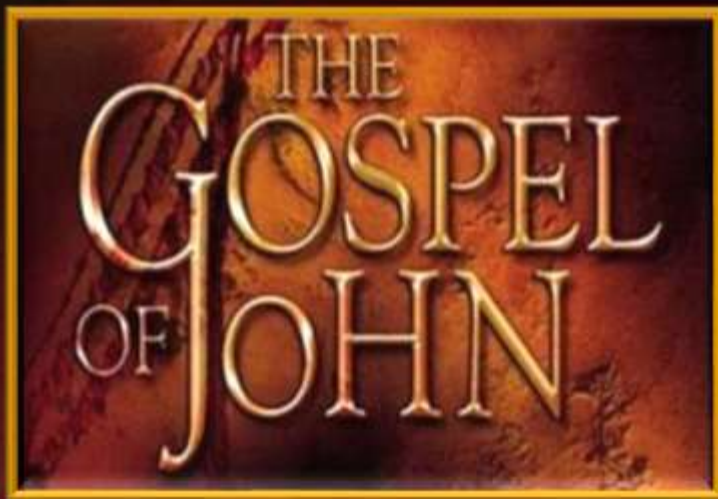
The writers of the Synoptic Gospels are 3 witnesses.
