The Gospel of John Introduction

Part 1: Yahusha & the Jews' Feast of Tabernacles

Why in the world is this chapter so important?

Do you know what John 7 is all about?

John Chapter 7 Starts Out Like This:

- 1. After these things **Yahusha** walked in Galilee: for he would not walk in Jewry, because the Jews sought to kill him.
- 2. Now the Jews' feast of tabernacles was at hand.
- 3. His brethren therefore said unto him, Depart hence, and go into Judaea, that thy disciples also may see the works that thou doest.
- 4. For there is no man that doeth any thing in secret, and he himself seeketh to be known openly. If thou do these things, shew thyself to the world.
- 5. For neither did his brethren believe in him.
- 6. Then Yahusha said unto them, My time is not yet come: but your time is alway ready.
- 7. The world cannot hate you; but me it hateth, because I testify of it, that the works thereof are evil.

- 8. Go ye up unto this feast: I go not up yet unto this feast; for my time is not yet full come.
- 9. When he had said these words unto them, he abode still in Galilee.
- 10. But when his brethren were gone up, then went he also up unto the feast, not openly, but as it were in secret.
- 11. Then the Jews sought him at the feast, and said, Where is he?
- 12. And there was much murmuring among the people concerning him: for some said, He is a good man: others said, Nay; but he deceiveth the people.
- 13. Howbeit no man spake openly of him for fear of the Jews.
- 14. Now about the midst of the [Jews'] feast Yahusha went up into the temple, and taught. KIV

This important festival gathering for Sukkot [Tabernacles] is recorded ONLY in John's Gospel!






Did you know that ...


The statute command reads like this [KJV]:

• Exo 23:16-17 And the feast of harvest, the firstfruits of thy labours, which thou hast sown in the field: and the feast of ingathering, which is in the end of the year, when thou hast gathered in thy labours out of the field. 17 Three times in the year all thy males shall appear before Yahuah your Elohim.









Another look at:

"... about the midst of the feast"?

Remember:

- the feast is 8 days long;
- the text says "about the middle"!
- Where is the "middle" of 8 days?
- Why would John say "about"?

These are the 2 middle days of the feast.

If Yahusha arrives "about the middle" of the Jew's Feast of Tabernacles, and went into the temple to teach, would this give any clues as to which day/cycle of the week this may be?

Because Yahusha is teaching in the temple:

... would one (or both) of those middle days ossibly be a feast Shabbat, or a weekly Shabbat?

Would you be surprised to find that John is going to tell us exactly which "days/cycles" of the week those two middle days will be? This is only through the comparison of the Lunar calendar with the Torah Covenant Calendar!



The only way that John can be so specific about the dating in chap. 7 is because the Gospels house the Lunar calendar of the unbelieving Jews and also the Torah Covenant Calendar that Yahusha observed.

The Gospels expose both the true & false calendars so all can know exactly which "calendar" Yahusha was following.
