


Do you know what John 7 is all about?



Will Yahusha's actions speak "louder than words" in John 7?

John Chapter 7 Starts Out Like This:

- 1. After these things **Yahusha** walked in Galilee: for he would not walk in Jewry, because the Jews sought to kill him.
- 2. Now the Jews' feast of tabernacles was at hand.
- 3. His brethren therefore said unto him, Depart hence, and go into Judaea, that thy disciples also may see the works that thou doest.
- 4. For there is no man that doeth any thing in secret, and he himself seeketh to be known openly. If thou do these things, **shew thyself to the world.**
- 5. For neither did his brethren believe in him.
- 6. Then Yahusha said unto them, My time is not yet come: but your time is alway ready.
- The world cannot hate you; but me it hateth, because I testify of it, that the works thereof are evil.



- 9. When he had said these words unto them, he abode still in Galilee.
- 10. But when his brethren were gone up, **then went he also up unto the feast**, not openly, but as it were **in secret**.
- 11. Then the Jews sought him at the feast, and said, Where is he?
- 12. And there was much murmuring among the people concerning him: for some said, He is a good man: others said, Nay; but he deceiveth the people.
- 13. Howbeit no man spake openly of him for fear of the Jews.
- 14. Now <u>about the midst of the</u> [Jews'] feast Yahusha went up into the temple, <u>and taught</u>. KJV

This important festival gathering for Sukkot [Tabernacles] is recorded <u>ONLY</u> in John's Gospel!

 Did you notice that the detail is very specific as to "whose" feast this is?



2. Does that mean this is also the timing of Yahusha's Festival Appointments?

3. Note: Because the synoptic gospels left out the details of this festival, do you suppose John includes this event for a very special reason? "What would that reason be?

Yahusha declared

Yahusha said to them, My time is not yet come: but your time is always ready. John 7:6


Why on earth would Yahusha intentionally distance Himself from a Feast that was originally commanded by Yahuah?

The Feast of Sukkot (Tabernacles) (found in Exo 23:16) is a Festival where **ALL MALES,** were required to be in attendance every year! Why? This is an **Everlasting Covenant** upheld under the **Melki-Tzedek Administration!**

Did you know that ...

The statute command reads like this [KJV]:

• Exo 23:16-17 And the feast of harvest, the firstfruits of thy labours, which thou hast sown in the field: and the feast of ingathering, which is in the end of the year, when thou hast gathered in thy labours out of the field. 17 Three times in the year all thy males shall appear before Yahuah your Elohim.



Does it sound like Yahusha is in rebellion while His brothers are obedient to the command for all men to "go up to Jerusalem" to attend the feast's appointed times?

Did Yahusha Change His Mind?

- "Go ye up unto this feast: <u>I go not up yet unto</u> <u>this feast</u>; for my time is not yet fully come."
- 9. When he had said these words unto them, he abode still in Galilee.

10. But when his brethren were gone up, <u>then went he also up</u> <u>unto the feast</u>, not openly, but as it were in secret.


