



We have also learned that just because *italicized words* are removed from the definitions does not necessarily mean "what is left" provides a correct interpretation and definition.

The definition must align with Moses and Torah. Moses never uses H2320 <chodesh> in Torah to define any new moon as commencing the new festal month.

... to look with pleasure or with interest at anything; hence Luther has rendered it correctly, die Sternkucker (Eng. ver. star-gazers).

They [Babylon's star-gazers] are described still further as those who make known with every new moon, ... things which, ... is used in a partitive sense: out of the great mass of events they select the most important, and prepare a calendar or almanac ... for the state every month.

1. There are many other Bible translations that translate Isa 47:13 according to the ways of Babylon – that of star-gazers and those that watch for every new moon – a monthly event.

There are several other Bible
 <u>Commentaries</u> that also interpret
 Isaiah 47:13 according to what was
 really happening in Babylon.

3. Because the translators for the KJV used the term "monthly prognosticators," rather than "those who predict by the new moons," did they actually remove important context from this verse? hey, mr. graduate, that is a good question. why didn't the translators use the word "moon" for H2320 <chodesh> this time like all the other times?

> remember, the action definition for the H2320 chodesh month is still a rebuilding, renewing & repetitive occurrence. these words also describe different moon phases observed by pagan Babylon for horoscope purposes. The context was not altered.

well, around 712 BC Yahuah's festal month and the lunar month still were both 30 days

in length.

mr. graduate, could I ask
you something else? I hear
there are some secular
historical quotes that
verify some of these
traditional discrepancies!

the changes of Yahuah's day-start and month-start are closely linked together. as time moves forward, i believe we will see more & more of these quotes.

yes, there are more and more historical quotes coming to the forefront all the time. we should examine a few of these.

Quote #1 linking to Isaiah 47:13

Morris N. Kertzer, What is a Jew, p. 108 • "When the Jews returned to Palestine <u>after</u> their Babylonian exile (516 BCE) <u>they</u> <u>brought back with them the Babylonian</u> <u>astronomy and way of reckoning time</u> ..."

Quote #2 linking to Isaiah 47:13 New Catholic Encyclopedia – Vol. 11, p. 1068 • "... especially after the Babylonian exile a number of significant and enduring changes occurred in the Israelite calendar showing that the Jews gradually adopted the Babylonian calendar of the time ... the seven day week persisted despite its failure to divide evenly either the month or the year. The day however, was counted from evening to evening, after the Babylonian fashion ...

mr graduate, if the Jews adopted the sunset day from Babylon, do you think they also adopted Babylon's month start according to the moon?

it certainly sounds logical doesn't it? we should consider another quote on this.

in this next quote, watch to see which type of calendar gave rise to the new viewpoint of the sunset day, which no doubt affected the crescent moon month start.



Quote #3 linking to Isaiah 47:13

Encyclopedic Dictionary of the Bible, p. 497 [besides the conception] "... the twenty-four hour • day begins at sunrise ... there arose another idea of the twenty-four hour day, according to which this daily period began at sunset. It was no doubt the lunar calendar of the Jews which gave rise to this viewpoint ..."


4. Remember, this ONE verse wasn't tampered with at all even though in this case H2320 could have been incorrectly translated as "new moon" (as the other 20 verses were)...



Conclusion for Isa 47:13

A mis-translation using "moon" would still have been in alignment with the context and the truth of the pagan cultures and their worship practices! Yet, this verse was left untouched!

Why? That's the Point!



There are 20 key "feast and festival" verses in the Old Testament that have been manipulated and tampered with to lead one to believe the Feast Months really do begin with the "new moon."

We must recognize this glaring counterfeit. Non-Torah Verses must be in alignment with Torah Truths.

Alignment of Psalm 81:3 & Numbers 10:10



Scripture Facts

[1450 BC] Num 10:10 ... in your solemn [feast] days, and in the beginnings of your months [H2320], ye shall blow with the trumpets ...

[1030 BC] **Ps 81:3 Blow up the trumpet** in the **new moon month** [**H2320**], in the time appointed, on our solemn feast day.

Comparison

- The Book of Numbers dates at least 420 years before Psalms.
- Numbers is Torah; Psalms is not.
- King David taught according to Torah.
- Psalm 81:3 must come into alignment with Numbers 10:10.
- The mis-translation of H2320 chodesh in Psalm 81 [KJV] (seen as "<u>new moon</u>") should be translated as "<u>new month</u>."

Remember this question: Has there been a deliberate attempt by the 1611 translators to save the new moon?

Comment:

Because the exiled Jews were indoctrinated with the Babylonian calendar beginning the day with sunset and the month with the crescent moon, one can see how these two concepts go together.
1. Once the sun sets - the new day begins;
2. Once the crescent moon is sighted, the new month begins the next day!
Despite what Yahuah's Covenant Calendar teaches, this new pagan calendar was eventually declared as a Torah truth.

There are NO New Moons for Yahuah's Festal Months!

This error has been accepted as a "Torah truth" likely because most people examined only these 20 verses. The majority of these verses are set in the context of Sabbaths, new moons, along with Feasts and Festivals. Problem: they are ALL non-Torah verses!

As mentioned before 20 verses represent only 7% of the 283 [PC Study Bible] references that must be searched out. (Note: H2320 references may differ with study tools. E-Sword = 279; Blue Letter Bible = 276.)

These things are certain:

- The 1611 Translators absolutely mis-translated the 20 non-Torah verses using "new moons" instead of "new months."
- Isa 47:13 is the "red flag" verse showing the Translators could have mis-translated this verse without altering the context. However, in this case they left H2320 as "monthly" rather than specifying the moon context.



Audience Participation

What are your thoughts on why the Translators of 1611 would succumb to such a final decision? There are 2 things that can be considered: 1. A prevalent Papal Roman influence, less than 100 years from Luther; 2. 1500+ years of Jewish Traditional influence Question: with roots in Babylon. Were these mis-translations done deliberately to remove Covenant Calendar keys in non-Torah books?

- Torah has 86 matches for H2320 all noted as "month."
- Not <u>ONE</u> Torah verse using H2320 <chodesh> was tampered with to read "moon" rather than "month"!

If the translators would have translated H2320 as "new month" instead of "new moon" for the 20 verses under examination, would that have made a difference for understanding the commencement of Yahuah's festal month today? There should be NO question about this!
